Richard Mullens of Sturminster Newton, Dorset, was the second husband of the widow Anne Thacker. As of now, we don't know Anne's maiden name. Richard was the stepfather to many important surnames of Western Bay, Newfoundland. These include Perry, Curtis and Snelgrove (of Lower Island Cove). Since there are very few written records in Newfoundland for the period, I must deduce what I can about the people we are interested in to see if I can make some connections.

Luckily, Richard Mullens did leave a good clue of his origins because of the very unusual name of his father: Renaltus. Through my careful review of the existing Dorset records, I have been able to pinpoint with a fair degree of accuracy when Richard Mullens lived. By inference therefore, the same timing should relate to his wife Anne.

In my search for Anne's identity, particularly her maiden name, learning what we can about Richard himself is very helpful.

This article is a companion to the papers on William Thacker and Anne Mullens (Thacker). These three papers shed a lot of light on the family and will be of interest to the descendants of Anne's daughters, Phillis Perry and Mary Curtis of Western Bay, and Ann Snelgrove of Lower Island Cove.
